District Grants

District Grants enable District 7690 Rotarians to be **personally involved** in **projects** that benefit their local communities or the world. These grants are not intended to replace funds currently raised by the club through other means.

With this in mind, the District Grants Committee has developed the following guidelines to assist clubs in deciding whether or not a project is appropriate for a DG application.

- The project cannot be one already undertaken and in progress, activities primarily sponsored by a non-Rotary organization, or for projects that are already completed.
- Large-scale, multi-year international projects should apply for a Global Grant rather than a District Grant.
- The project must actively involve Rotarians in planning and carrying out the project, not simply in fundraising for the club's portions of the expenses.
- The project cannot directly benefit a Rotarian or family member of a Rotarian.
- The projects may be either domestic or international.
- The DG may be used for infrastructure depending on the project (see below).
- The DG must be matched at least 1:1 with a cash contribution from the club.
- Projects must be completed by May 1, 2014. Final reports and all receipts must be submitted by May 15, 2014.
- Go to www.rotary7690.org to find initial application and final report forms.
- Clubs may submit multiple district grant applications up to two times the amount listed in the Club Allocation Chart.

District Grants

The District Grant may **NOT** be used for:

- Compensation or personal services
- Purchase of land or buildings
- Travel expenses
- Administrative expenses
- Construction or renovation projects for facilities where people live, work, engage in gainful activity or which are used for storage, e.g. electrification, windows/doors, walls/roof, general refurbishment, HVAC, repairs of utilities, plumbing
- Fundraising activities such as a golf tournament
- "Pass through" donations to a charity

TIME LINE AND NOTES for 2013-2014 DISTRCT GRANTS

May 15, 2013	Final reports and receipts must be received for 2012 District Grant projects. New applications will be not be considered if a final report is outstanding.
May 31, 2013	District Grant Application period closes.
July, 2013	Clubs that applied in the initial period are notified with decisions on their applications
Aug 1, 2013	Deadline for 2 nd round of applications. (if necessary)
Aug 31, 2013	Clubs that applied in the second round notified with decisions on their applications.
May 1, 2014	Projects must be completed.
May 15, 2014	Final report and all receipts must be submitted.

The district has a maximum of \$79,000 available for District Grants in 2013-2014. Applications will be considered according to the deadlines noted above, so clubs are strongly encouraged to submit applications as soon as possible. **Applications received in the second period will be considered only if remaining funds are available for distribution.**

The A-B-C's of Global Grants

Qualification of your Club

Your club must be qualified by the district before it can apply for global grants, but qualification is simple. In order to qualify, your club must:

- 1. Attend a grants management seminar
- 2. Have the club President and President-Elect sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and submit the signed MOU to the district. The MOU is an agreement between the club and the district explaining the minimum Foundation requirements for managing grants. It ensures that your club has the appropriate controls in place to manage global grants.
- 3. Follow any additional district qualification guidelines, as determined by the district.

Creating a Project

Your club's global grant project must have a minimum budget of \$35,000 (see budget description below), be sustainable into future years, and you must partner with an international club or international district. Your club has great flexibility in the type of project it would like to create, but it must address at least one of Rotary's six areas of focus:

- 1. Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- 2. Disease prevention and treatment
- 3. Water and sanitation
- 4. Maternal and child health
- 5. Basic education and literacy
- 6. Economic and community development

Before applying for a global grant, clubs should take time to create a project that includes a community assessment, strong partnership, and a detailed implementation plan with measureable, achievable goals.


As stated above, the global grant project must have a minimum budget of \$35,000. Individual Rotarian cash contributions (i.e. contributions from your club and partner clubs within our district) must total at least \$10,000. These individual contributions are matched 100% by the District (DDF Funds) and 50% by the Rotary Foundation's World Fund. In addition, the World Fund also matches 100% of the District's match. The chart below shows this more clearly.


Application Process

Before completing the formal application, your club must obtain prior approval to apply for the global grant from District 7690, and must complete the District 7690 Global Grants Checklist. You can request this approval by emailing the District 7690 Global Grants Committee, and including a short summary and the budget for your proposed project. This step is necessary in order for District 7690 to ascertain that it has sufficient matching funds available for your proposed project. Once your club has received approval to proceed, you can then begin the formal application process, as described below.


The Rotary Foundation has developed a comprehensive online application that can be accessed at www.rotary.org. When you get to the website, you will login under "Member Access", as shown below.




Once you have logged into "Member Access" you will click on the "Rotary Foundation Grants (2013-2014)" located on the left hand side of the screen under the Future Vision heading, as shown below.




Once you have clicked on the "Rotary Foundation Grants (2013-2014)", you will click on the "Grants Basics" tab on the top of the screen, then the "Manage Grants" link, as shown below.



Once you have clicked on the "Manage Grants" link, you will click on the "Global Grants" link on the left hand side of the screen, as shown below.



Once you have clicked on the "Global Grants" link, you will click on the "Start" link in the middle of the screen, as shown below. This is where you will key in your global grant application.



Oversight and Reporting

Rotary Foundation funds must be treated as a sacred trust and managed with proper stewardship. Once your Rotary Foundation Global Grant has been approved, you will receive funds to implement the grant. The keys to successful oversight are having a financial management plan and document retention plan to facilitate reporting and potential audits by The Rotary Foundation.

Project expenditures should be made by check or other traceable method whenever possible, and supporting detailed receipts must be maintained for each transaction. A general ledger must be maintained and will help your club record all grant activities. Your club should maintain a club-controlled bank account that is used solely for receiving and disbursing Foundation grant funds.

Maintaining detailed records ensures that the club complies with the club MOU, local laws, and standard business practices. Make copies of all documents to ensure that the club's activities can continue uninterrupted in case of fire or other catastrophe. Retain all documents required by the financial management plan in a location that is known and accessible to more than one person.

Grant recipients are responsible for reporting on the use of grant funds in accordance with the terms and conditions of the grant. Typically, there are interim and final reporting requirements. In addition, there are reporting responsibilities for both your club and your international partner club. It is vitally important that you contact your international partner club regularly and that they complete their obligations under the grant.

ROTARY DISTRICT 7690 CULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

Below is the timetable for the 2013 application process for selecting cultural scholars from Rotary District 7690.

Rotary District 7690 Cultural Scholarships – 1 up to \$10,000 will be awarded for three months of language study. The primary purpose of a Rotary Foundation Cultural Scholarship is to have the scholar gain proficiency in a foreign language and to contribute to international understanding through study abroad.

Cultural Scholars Must have completed at least 2 years of college. Award up to 3 months

Must have some prior knowledge of the language.

Must enroll in assigned language school.

Examples of candidates are elementary and secondary school teachers, librarians, public servants, i.e., public health,

fire safety and social services counselors.

May not be a Rotarian or a relative of a Rotarian

Paul Harris Society of Rotary District 7690

- 1) The Paul Harris Society pledge is for a gift of \$1000 a year. Club Foundation points may not be used to fund the PHS pledge. The full \$1000 must be paid during the Rotary year (by June 30) though it need not be done in one check. You may pay in installments. Please indicate on your commitment pledge form if you will pay in Club installments or TRF Direct.
- 2) You don't have to be a Paul Harris Fellow first in order to become a Paul Harris Society member. If you are not already a Paul Harris Fellow, you will become one as soon as you fully fund your PHS pledge. Make your check payable to "The Rotary Foundation" and send to Margaret Padgett per the pledge form. When your pledge is fully funded, your PHF will be ordered from the Rotary Foundation and your Paul Harris Society recognition will be prepared by the District.
- 3) With each \$1000 gift you will receive multiple PHF recognition with appropriate PHF pin and stones after your first PHF. You may also name a new Paul Harris Fellow using the recognition points from your account.
- 4) Contributions to the Annual Programs Fund will go to fund Foundation programs. In three years the Rotary Foundation will return 50% of the District's Annual Giving to the District as District Designated Funds to be used for the Foundation's humanitarian and educational programs by the District Rotary Clubs. You may also designate a portion or all of your contribution to PolioPlus.
- 5) All previous personal gifts to the Foundation are counted toward Major Donor recognition. Your pledge of \$1000 annually will enable you to become a Major Donor very quickly.
- 6) A personal gift already made to the Annual Programs Fund or PolioPlus this year will count toward your Paul Harris Society pledge. For example, if you have already made a \$200 gift this year, you can become a Paul Harris Society member with an additional gift of \$800.
- 7) The Paul Harris Society is an official Rotary Foundation program, but, all administration and recognition is at the District level. A special PHS banner will be presented to each Club when they achieve their first PHS member. Recognition of new Paul Harris Society members will be made at the Foundation Banquet as well as at the member's club.

MAKING A CONTRIBUTION ON LINE AT THE ROTARY FOUNDATION WEBSITE

Many Rotarians enjoy the simplicity of making their contributions to the Rotary Foundation on line. It's a very easy and secure process. All that is needed is a valid credit card number and access to the Rotary Foundation website.

The contributor will receive an email receipt within a few minutes of making the contribution. The contributor should save the email receipt on his/her computer, forward a copy of the receipt to the club secretary for club record keeping, and print out a copy for his/her permanent tax records. The entire process is complete within five minutes.

- ** Most on line contributions will be made to the Annual Fund. However, some donations will be made to the Permanent Fund (Benefactor), Polio Plus, or a Global Grant. If in doubt, check with your club's Rotary Foundation chairman or your Foundation Advocate.



The CRS is available through Member Access to DGs, DGEs, District Rotary Foundation Chairs, Annual Giving Subcommittee Chairs, Club Presidents and Club Secretaries.

- A. District and Club numbers (needed to sign-up for Member Access)
- B. All-time number of Paul Harris Fellows for this Rotary Club
- C. Total number of Benefactors
- D. All-time club contributions since its inception (excluding Permanent Fund contributions)
- E. "*" indicates deceased individuals
- F. Member ID (needed to sign-up for Member Access, also printed on The Rotarian)
- G. "+" indicates that the individual is a Benefactor (has contributed \$1,000 to the Permanent Fund or made provisions in their will of at least \$1,000 benefiting The Rotary Foundation)
- H. Name of the individual (Line 1 shows name and available Recognition Points of the Club)
- I. Shows active / inactive membership status (deceased, former members and non-Rotarians with a contribution history are included on the CRS and show an "N" in this column)
- J. Shows Recognition Amount, which can be a combination of cash contributions and Foundation Recognition Points received (Recognition Points do not count toward Major Donor recognition)
- K. A "+" indicates that the actual Recognition Amount is greater than the maximum of 9,000 that can be shown on the Club Recognition Summary
- L. Displays the date on which the individual's cumulative giving to APF-SHARE reached US\$100 or more during the current Rotary year (use to track your Club's Foundation Sustaining Members)
- M. Date cumulative giving reached or surpassed US\$100 during the last Rotary Year
- N. Indicates Paul Harris Fellow or multiple PHF status
- Month and Year the first Paul Harris Fellow recognition was achieved
- P. Lists available Foundation Recognition Points, which can be transferred to other individuals to help them achieve their first or multiple Paul Harris Fellow recognition. Foundation Recognition Points start to accumulate 1:1 for every dollar contributed once PHF status is achieved



Using the Club Recognition Summary (CRS)

Using Foundation Recognition Points to increase contributions to The Rotary Foundation

Foundation Recognition Points (FRP) become available 1:1 for every dollar contributed once an individual's Recognition Amount reaches 1,000. Rotarians and individuals achieve PHF status by contributing US\$1,000 outright, by receiving 1,000 recognition points from others, or through a combination of cash and points that total 1,000.

The number of FRPs a Rotarian can award to others is shown in the far right column (P) of the CRS report. Members can transfer their own FRPs by completing and submitting Form 102 (available for download at www.rotary.org). Club FRPs (shown on the first line of the report) can be transferred by having the Club President complete and submit Form 102.

TIP: Many Rotary Clubs use a matching system to help their members achieve Paul Harris Fellow recognition, and to promote additional support for The Rotary Foundation. To determine if your club is close to achieving 100% Paul Harris Fellow status, review the Recognition Amounts of all Rotarians who are currently listed as active club members (indicated by a "Y" in column I). Determine the amount needed to get all members to at least 1,000 as shown in Recognition Amount column J. Matching their contribution with Foundation Recognition Points may help you reach or even surpass your club's Annual Programs Fund goal as well as achieve 100% Paul Harris Fellow Recognition for your Rotary Club.


Promoting Annual Programs Fund support by recognizing Foundation Sustaining Members

The number of Foundation Sustaining Members can be tracked by reviewing the information in column L: the CRS will show the date when US\$ 100 or more in cumulative giving (excluding Permanent Fund contributions) are recorded for that Rotarian in the current Rotary Year. The Club Success Kit contains one sheet of *Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member Badge Stickers* (956). Additional sheets can be ordered free of charge by visiting http://shop.rotary.org. To promote awareness and to recognize Sustaining Members, affix a sticker to all member name badges who become Sustaining Members during the Rotary Year.

Two Needs, Two Ways of Giving – Promoting Benefactors and Permanent Fund support

A "+" symbol in column G identifies Benefactors on the CRS report. Benefactors are individuals who have given US\$ 1,000 or more to the Permanent Fund, or who have committed US\$1,000 or more in their will to The Rotary Foundation. Rotarians can become Benefactors by completing and submitting the Benefactor Commitment Card (Form 149, available for download at www.rotary.org).

The investment earning from the Permanent Fund are already having a significant impact in helping fund Foundation programs. Supporting the Permanent Fund is a way to leave a personal legacy with Rotary, and to keep the work of Rotary financially supported for future generations. In addition to setting an Annual Programs Fund Goal, clubs are also encouraged to set an annual goal for new Benefactors.

Club presidents, club secretaries, club Rotary Foundation chairs, and Assistant Governors are able to access club's Rotary Foundation records (assuming those officers are registered in their positions at Rotary International). Access to club records is a good way to verify contributions sent by the club have been posted. Those records are also helpful for clubs pursuing 100% Sustaining or EREY recognition.
