\$ 5,000	World Fund Match of Rotarian Cash Contribution
\$35,000	TOTAL PROJECT COST



District Qualification

Before applying for grants, district officers agree to implement the financial and stewardship requirements in the memorandum of understanding (MOU) by completing the online qualification process.

District Grants

District grants are block grants that allow clubs and districts to address immediate needs in their communities and abroad.

Global Grants

Global grants, which range from US\$15,000 to US\$200,000, fund large international humanitarian projects, vocational training teams, and scholarships that have sustainable, measurable outcomes in one or more of the areas of focus.

Packaged Grants

Packaged grants allow clubs and districts to work with Rotary's strategic partners to implement pre-designed projects.

- Funds electronically deposited from The Rotary Foundation into the separate club bank account established for Global Grants
- Disbursing funds
- Bookkeeping
- Monitor budget vs. actual



Financial Management Plan

- Disbursing Funds
- Bookkeeping
- Make copies
- Provide access to District & The Rotary Foundation
- Retain for a minimum of five years



Reporting

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION



Reporting Requirements: Frequency

- Progress reports
 - Within 12 months of first payment
 - Every 12 months through the life of the grant
- Final report within 2 months of completion
- Must provide detailed supporting documentation of disbursements
