

District Conference Highlight


If you have never been to District Conference because you couldn't get excited about another Rotary meeting, then hold on to your seat because the 2008 Rotary 7690 District Conference at Chateau Elan Resort and Spa is sure to get your blood pumping!

We fully expect this year's conference to be a complete sellout with the incredible lineup of events, speakers and entertainment that are scheduled. Mark your calendars now for April 24-27, 2008 and let me share with you in this column over the coming months some of the details of this very exciting annual gathering of leading Rotarians in the 50 clubs of 7690.

"Sharing Rotary is Peachy at Château Elan" is our conference theme this year and this fits right into Rotary International's theme of Sharing Rotary.....and with Chateau Elan in North Georgia, you now understand the origination of "Peachy". We will have fun with this theme in a number of ways that all are sure to enjoy.

Our keynote speaker and fellow Rotarian, Dr. Nido Qubein, is a true headliner the quality of which we have never experienced at a district conference. Dr. Qubein's personal story of success is truly inspirational. He came to America at 17 years of age 7000 miles from his home, didn't speak our language, had no connections and only \$50.00 in his pocket. He learned the English language by writing 10 English words a night on a 3" x 5" card memorizing their spelling, meaning and pronunciation. He did this 6 nights a week, taking Sunday off, for 52 weeks, learning 3120 words in a year. With basically 2/3rds the vocabulary of the average American, he has gone on to write 15 books that have been converted into over 20 languages around the world.

Dr. Qubein is currently the president of High Point University, his alma mater where he served on the Board of Trustees for 8 years before being recruited by HPU's board to lead HPU's extraordinary transformation, but has built his career as one of the nation's top speakers and business consultants.



He owns several businesses, is Chairman of the Board of Great Harvest Franchising Inc. and sits on the Executive Board of BB&T Corporation. He was awarded the Cavet Award, the Oscar of public speaking and was inducted into the International Speakers Hall of Fame.

Dr. Qubein was awarded the Ellis Island Medal of Honor along with four U.S. Presidents and in April of 2005 was inducted into the Horatio Alger Society of Distinguished Americans. There are only about 270 living Horatio Alger members and this group includes such accomplished people as Howard Schultz, founder of Starbucks, Truet Caffey, founder of Chick-Fil-A, Oprah Winfrey and Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas.

Dr. Qubein will share his wit and wisdom with those fortunate enough to attend District Conference as he weaves the theme, Rotary Shares in his inspirational message.
