Rotary District 7690 Welcomes John Osterlund, Speaker Rotary Foundation Banquet, November 12, 2009

Born in Oak Park, Illinois, John grew up in Sebring, Florida. After graduating from the University of South Florida with a B.A. in Political Science, he became interested in the Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship program. John was awarded a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship for the academic year 1987-88. With his Scandinavian heritage it was to John's advantage that he was placed at the University of Stockholm.

John received his M.S. degree in History Education from Florida State University. After graduate school, John moved to Fort Lauderdale to become the Legislative Aide to State Senator Tom McPherson and to be an adjunct history instructor at Broward Community College. Working in state politics, John gained extensive experience in media relations and fund raising. John went on to work as the Administrative Assistant to the Majority Leader of the Florida House of Representatives, Rep. Anne Mackenzie.

The Rotary Foundation is one of the largest charitable organizations in the United States in terms of fundraising and international grantmaking. As the General Manager of The Rotary Foundation, John oversees the operations of five divisions: Humanitarian Grant Programs, Educational Programs, PolioPlus, Fund Development, and, Operations and Administration. In 2002-03, John served as the Associate Director of the Foundation's US\$80 million Polio Eradication Fundraising Campaign — a campaign conducted in one year which raised more than US\$135 million to further Rotary's goal of eradicating polio. In 2006-07, The Rotary Foundation was successful in raising more than US\$130 million.

John is married to Elizabeth Gaizutis Osterlund. The Osterlunds live in Evanston and have three children: two sons, Benjamin and Peter, and a daughter, Abigail. John is a member of the Evanston Lighthouse Rotary Club, a Paul Harris Fellow and a benefactor.

\$50,000 and 276,845 Polio Vaccinations!

That's the impact of 'Grow Your Business and Help a Great Cause'. As many of you know, on October 19, 2009, we ran a unique fundraising campaign to eradicate polio, one of Rotary International's top focus areas.

The day of professional development drew an excellent response! The event, spearheaded by Abby Donnelly, a past president of Crescent Rotary, District Membership Chair and RLI Chair, and presented *pro bono* by her company, Sandler Training®, brought in almost 200 business professionals actively engaged in the training—learning new strategies, tools and techniques to increase sales, improve productivity and grow their business. Abby Donnelly, partner at Sandler Training, a local franchise of Maryland-based professional development firm Sandler Systems, was proud to be able to combine her passion for developing strong business leaders with her commitment to Rotary International. 'When business professionals improve their leadership, management and sales skills, everyone wins!' Donnelly said. 'We have a more effective work force, better business results, a stronger local economy – and we raised a lot of money to eradicate polio.'

With sponsorship support from local businesses, including presenting sponsor Sandler Training, Gold Sponsor Edward Jones, and in-kind sponsors including Fairway Outdoor Advertising, The Business Journal, and Koury Convention Center, plus a very generous Rotary District match, the day netted over \$50,000. When combined with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation match, we will provide funding to vaccinate over 276,845 children from polio. Since more than 70% of the participants were not Rotarians (yet!), it also broadened Rotary's visibility in the district and provided membership growth potential.

District Governor Mike Conrad says, "The program is an example of creative ways to involve the community in the world-wide campaign to eradicate polio and to tell the story of what Rotary is doing outside our own area". \$99 early registration is open for next year's event! Triad Flight of Honor Shares Special Connection to Rotarian Howard Allred

The Triad Flight of Honor is a service project of Rotary District 7690. Rotarians, other community organizations, businesses, and the general public are united to honor WW II veterans for their courage, valor, and sacrifice. We successfully completed two flights in October taking 200 WW II veterans, 66 guardians, medical teams and other volunteers on a one-day flight on board a US Airways charter to Washington, DC.

WW II veterans once numbered 16 million, but the numbers are dropping at the rate of 1,200 per day. Many of these veterans have never seen their National WW II Memorial that opened in Washington in 2004. The veterans who are still with us are in their 80's and 90's.

As most of you know, High Point Rotarian Howard Allred (father of PDG Don Allred) passed away on October 12, 2009, just 9 days after going on the inaugural Triad Flight of Honor. All of the volunteers on the flight were honored and grateful to have shared this special day with him. At our committee meeting in early October, we shared the email Howard had sent thanking everyone for the great job in organizing this event. He was in awe of our ability to pull everything together and expressed his gratitude to the Mid State Rotary Club for sponsoring him. The last memory I have of Howard was watching him walk down the airport terminal to embrace his wife, Anne who was there to welcome him home. I wouldn't give anything for that picture!

The memory of Howard will inspire and motivate all of us as we look forward to future flights. Two flights in 2010 are already scheduled for April 17 and May 22 with more to follow if our funding needs are met. It costs \$500 to sponsor a WW II veteran to visit the WW II Memorial and other sites of interest. If a Rotary club sponsors 3 veterans, they will be guaranteed a guardian position for a \$200 fee.

DG Mike Conrad and I both remember so vividly the joy in Howard's face the day of the flight. It is our goal to create the same opportunity for all of our WW II veterans in our community to feel the sense of pride and appreciation that Howard felt on October 3rd.
