ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The twenty-ninth annual Rotary Youth Leadership Program (RYLP) was held July 17-23, 2011, on the campus at Guilford College in Greensboro. The RYLP utilizes the leadership skills and experience of regional business, community and Rotary leaders, Center for Creative Leadership facilitators, and recent RYLP alumni to provide unique leadership training for the 55 high school students who were selected from among applicants throughout Piedmont North Carolina. The entire RYLP cost for each student, including room, board and leadership training, was paid by a sponsoring Rotary Club in the student's county. Past participants have used their enhanced skills to lead more effectively in student governments, in other school activities, and in their communities.

Approximately thirty-five District 7690 Rotary Clubs have participated in the Rotary Youth Leadership Program over the last three years, and the RYLP directors are hopeful that each club in the District will participate soon, either individually or through joint sponsorships with other clubs.

Call For District Governor Candidates

Any club wishing to submit a candidate for District Governor for 2014-2015 Rotary year must submit his or her name with complete qualifications NO LATER than OCTOBER 25, 2011. Forms have been mailed to club presidents. The Chairman of the Nominating Committee is PDG Charles Allen. The candidate must be available for an interview on Tuesday, November 1. The completed forms should be mailed to the Rotary District Office, 114 Willoughby Park, High Point, NC 27265 and must be received by October 25, 2011.

WOMEN'S HEALTH PROJECT

Area 4 Clubs plus Walnut Cove in District 7690 sponsored a project in Girls' and Women's Health this year in Kitgum, Uganda. We want to expand this to a model Mother/Child Health project with a vocational team. This project can serve as an model for the Government of Uganda whose health papers call for mobile mother/child health to be a priority in Northern Uganda. Our project can also serve as an example to interested NGO's.

We need to raise \$60,000 of the \$250,000 needed for this global project which will fund a mobile ambulance, fit it with consumables, medical necessities, an ultrasound, a refrigerator unit and staff it with a midwife, nurse, nurse practitioner and driver. The mobile mother/child health unit will make 4 visits a month to 16 villages in rural areas remote from functional health centers. 800-1000 consultations a months will occur, children under 5 will receive scheduled immunizations, pregnant women will be tested and treated if needed for HIV-AIDS and malaria, malnutrition and given ultrasounds after 30 weeks. The MCH unit will train and educate existing traditional birth attendants and village health teams, hold seminars and train health personnel in clinics, and provide bicycles to health clinic staff to continue the outreach programs at the end of the training.



Please consider being a part of this project. I have a presentation which I am ready to give. If a few clubs distant from Mount Airy could possibly meet together it would make it easier for me to give presentations, but I will work with whatever you find best. The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

As one of the one hundred Future Vision Pilot Districts we have awarded District Designated Funds (DDF) of \$ 95,272 in District Grant awards for Rotary year 2011-12. These DDF awards are supporting fifty grants involving forty-four Rotary clubs in District 7690.

Thirty-five of the grants support local projects in our home communities while fifteen support international needs in Nicaragua, Dominican Republic, Mexico and wherever the next food crisis occurs in the world.

As required, these projects support one or more of the Six Areas of Focus of the Rotary Foundation.

1. Peace and conflict prevention/ resolution
2. Disease prevention and treatment
3. Water and sanitation
4. Maternal and child health
5. Basic education and literacy
6. Economic and community development

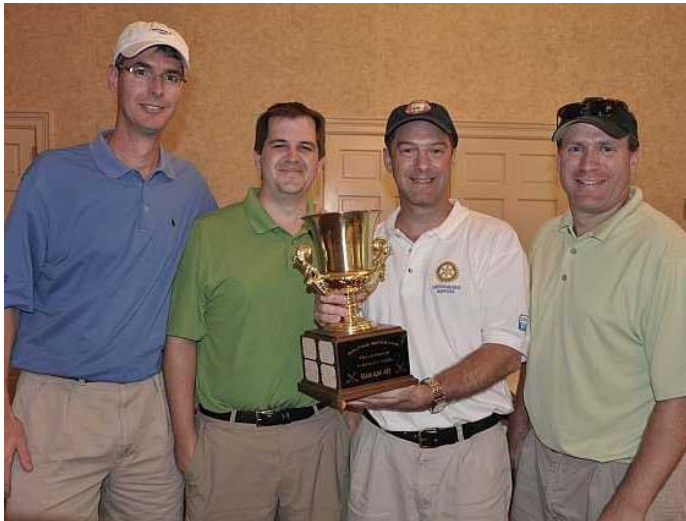
