Once in operation the Rio de Verde club is responsible for monitoring and reporting to the Asheboro club as to its effectiveness in meeting the Global Project's goals. The Rio de Verde club is also tasked with record keeping of financial disbursements. and reporting to the Asheboro Rotary Club through Rev. Dr. Santos.

The Asheboro Club's overall responsibility is assuring that the host Rotary club and partners understand their roles; that the clinic is in operation in a timely manner; that the clinic is meeting the stated needs of the people of Dom Miguel, and that the Rio Verde community has the opportunity to participate in its long-term sustainability.

By law all Brazilians are entitled to free health care, but it's very underfunded. The poor get no medical care or wait for very long times. (1) Insufficient access to medical treatment; (2) No or little prenatal and childhood screening; (3) No or little medical treatment of the elderly; No childhood immunizations; (5) A general lack of trained nurses and technicians

This mission in Rio Verde has been coordinated since 2001 by the Rev. Dr. Eudoxio Santos, Chaplin at the HERV. The city mayor and health dept have been actively engaged in many planning meetings for this clinic and the adjacent elementary school. This is the seventh clinic in the City's attempt to improve the availability of medical treatment. I have developed several Rotarian friends in the ensuing years who have the same concerns.

Global Grant Agreement

I confirm and agree to the following:

5. TRF's entire responsibility is expressly limited to payment of the total financing amount. TRF does not assume any further responsibility in connection with this grant.

6. TRF reserves the right to cancel the grant and/or this Agreement without notice upon the failure of either or both of the Sponsors to abide by the terms set forth in this Agreement and the Terms and Conditions. Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.

7. The laws of the State of Illinois, USA, without reference to its conflicts of laws principles, shall govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.

8. Any legal action brought by either party against the other party arising out of or relating to this Agreement must be brought in either, the Circuit Court of Cook County, State of Illinois, USA or the Federal District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, USA. Each party consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of these courts, and their respective appellate courts for the purpose of such actions. Nothing herein prohibits a party that obtains a judgment in either of the designated courts from enforcing the judgment in any other court. Notwithstanding the foregoing, TRF may also bring legal action against Sponsors and/or individuals traveling on grant funds in any court with jurisdiction over them.

9. This Agreement binds and benefits the parties and their respective administrators, legal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns.

10. If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
