- Expecting mothers will be trained by community health workers & medical professionals on the importance of prenatal care which includes prenatal vitamins, periodic check-ups.
- Program Expansion/outreach in training medical doctors at into regional hospitals identified by PHC to increase access for indigent patients to receive vital life saving heart surgeries. The training, licensing, accreditation and certification will be provide and overseen by PHC. We will provide patient support and supplies.

Through Community Assessment and by Philippine Heart Center physicians.

Objectives:

1. Understanding the cultural and socioeconomic barriers that prevent mothers from seeking care & treatment.
2. Educating the Community Health Workers (Barangay Workers) on how to address these needs to help alleviate preventable diseases and improve health.

- Drinking safe potable waters
- Brushing teeth regularly (dental care leads to healthier bodies)

"What conditions can be linked to oral health?"

Your oral health might contribute to various diseases and conditions, including:

Endocarditis. This infection of the inner lining of your heart chambers or valves (endocardium) typically occurs when bacteria or other germs from another part of your body, such as your mouth, spread through your bloodstream and attach to certain areas in your heart.

Cardiovascular disease. Although the connection is not fully understood, some research suggests that heart disease, clogged arteries and stroke might be linked to the inflammation and infections that oral bacteria can cause. Pregnancy and birth complications. Periodontitis has been linked to premature birth and low birth weight. Pneumonia. Certain bacteria in your mouth can be pulled into your lungs, causing pneumonia and other respiratory diseases."

They are often composed of midwives who frequently deliver babies as mothers are fearful or do not have access to reaching a hospital to deliver their babies. To enable us to reach the communities that do not have access to care due to region, lack of funds and more, we need to work with training these "boots on the ground" workers who provide, in many cases, the only link to health care for these areas.

Outreach through schools and networks. Will provide attendance certification and feeding during training.
