

Rotary District 7690 Executive Committee Meeting Minutes September 12, 2024

Approval of last meeting minutes (July 18, 2024): Debbie Scott noted that the July 18 meeting header had an incorrect heading. James moved to approve the minutes and Mark seconded the motion; The minutes were approved as amended.

III. Reports from Committee Members

- A. Foundation Report: James Gouty, DRFC
 - 1. Foundation Banquet. There are 232 registrations currently, and we set a goal of 700. There was discussion about some fundraising items to auction at the Banquet.
 - 2. Block grants. We have not issued any DDF checks yet because RI has not approved the block grant yet.
 - 3. The Fall training seminar is Saturday, September 14, and the theme is People of Action.
 - 4. The Million Dollar Dinner is scheduled for Mark Brandon's year 2025-2026.
 - 5. The countdown for history (eradicating polio) is pushed back to 2029 due to 26 to 33 new cases reported in Afghanistan and Pakistan this year. Debbie reported setting a goal of \$250,000 for Polio Plus.
- B. Membership Report: Jon Spillman, DMC, PDG
 - 1. The Membership Summit was a success.
 - 2. The membership report is attached.
 - 3. Highlights are that 23 clubs have increased their membership since the beginning of the year. We are plus 52 members in the district overall.
 - 4. Ron explained his "Home for the Holidays" initiative.

- C. Public Image: Tim Johnson, PI Chair.
 - 1. Tim's report is attached.
 - 2. Tim purchased an ad for the District website that ran over 5 days at a cost of \$30. The ad achieved 2414 views and 1214 post engagements. That represents a cost of \$0.02 per post engagement. Mark stated that he and Rich Blakemore plan to revamp the website.
- D. Youth Services Report: Brent Holmes, YS Chair
 - 1. Brent's YS report is attached.
 - 2. Brent requested \$5300 to pay for a district wide Interact conference. Brent wanted to schedule the conference for November 9th. After discussion, it was agreed to postpone the conference to sometime in the spring. Andy reported that we have \$2290 in the budget for Youth Services.

IV. Old Business

- A. Chris Justice and Debbie Branson Doby will email a rough draft of the MOP to members in November to preview prior to our meeting in January.
- B. Van is working on building his committee members for writing an updated Disaster relief plan.

V. New Business:

- A. There was a wide-spread food poisoning at the District Membership Summit of people who ate the Caesar chicken wrap. Sedgefield Country Club reimbursed us for the cost of the event. There was discussion about what to do with the refunded money, but no decision was made. DG Ron is the point person for all inquiries.
- B. Pmail blasts: Mark and Karen are working on a plan to achieve more consistency in sending out pmail blasts.
- C. Tangible incentive structure for DAA. Karen Pollard suggested that we increase the DDF money to the clubs who achieve platinum level DAA.
- D. Karen moved to switch the finance module from Quickbooks to the DACdb financial module beginning on 1 July 2025. James seconded the motion, and it passed.
