




Wilma Rudolph, Polio and Rotary's Mission

A little over 65 years ago, Wilma Rudolph, who spent years overcoming the effects of Polio, became the first American woman to win three gold medals in a single Olympic game. Two distinct life lessons come from Wilma Rudolph's journey:

- 1) Obstacles Are Meant to Be Overcome After contracting polio and scarlet fever as a child, Wilma was told she might never walk again. Thanks to her determination, she not only walked but became the fastest woman alive. As Wilma noted, "The triumph can't be had without the struggle."
- 2) <u>Strong Support System</u> Wilma's mother refused to accept the doctors' grim prognosis and regularly took her to a hospital 50 miles away for treatment. At home, her family administered therapy multiple times a day.



Wilma's example and life story are reminders of two important things when it comes to Rotary membership.

1) Remember the Mission – First, whether it is polio or membership efforts, we can't let temporary setbacks define us. Second, membership isn't a numbers game. It is a people mission. It's about changing lives and making our communities better. As stated in Rotary's vision statement:

TOGETHER we see a world
Where PEOPLE unite and take action
To CREATE lasting
CHANGE across the globe in our communities and in ourselves

2) Support System for Clubs - As our 2020-2021 Rotary International President Holger Knack noted: "Every great Rotary Initiative begins in a club." Rotary is bottom up not a top-down organization. Rotary International and District efforts and resources are intentionally designed to help clubs have a greater impact on their members and their respective communities.

Lastly, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to all you for allowing me to serve as District Membership Chair the last 3 years. It has been truly amazing to have a front row seat to all of the good our clubs do, and I know the best is yet to come!

Meet Global Grant Scholar Holly Miranda



Rotary's Global Grant Scholarship program supports exceptional students committed to a career trajectory in focused areas of great humanitarian need and pursuing the goal of achievable and sustainable change. As ambassadors of goodwill, Rotary Global Scholars strive to find the best in themselves and use their knowledge, skills, abilities, to make life better for others. Holly Miranda, Rotary District 7690's newest Global Scholar is a shining exemplar. Her scholarship will take her to the National Taiwan University (NTU) in Taipei for graduate studies in the field of Disease Prevention and Treatment. Already accepted into the two-year Master of Science in Global Health academic program, she begins this quest in the fall of 2025 and graduates in the summer of 2027.

Holly is from the coastal community of Hampton, New Hampshire, USA. In 2020, she graduated with honors from Elon University with a Bachelor of Arts with dual majors in Public Health and International/Global Studies. As part of her curriculum, Holly studied abroad in Iringa, Tanzania, where she learned that targeted, community level interventions can improve long-term health outcomes. Specifically, recognizing that financial barriers prevented villagers from seeking medical care, her team worked with a local vocational school to implement a chicken husbandry course, thus empowering women to generate independent income for access to healthcare. While in Tanzania her multicultural experiences included field trip to a healer's clinic, a safari in Ruaha National Park, and a homestay opportunity in a village two hours from the nearest paved road to assist her host family with farming.

Meet Global Grant Scholar Holly Miranda

The adage "if you love what you do, then it's not really work", is actually a truism for Holly following graduation. Holly participated in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) competitive Public Health Associates Program where she served as a COVID-19 Epidemiologist at the Kentucky Department for Public Health. This sparked her professional passion to be the best version of herself as an Epidemiologist. Conducting data analysis on COVID-19 mortalities, her work led to ensuring vaccination sites were placed in communities disproportionately affected by the pandemic. For her, the experience reinforced the importance of data-driven decision-making in disease prevention. Her next assignment took her to Vermont as an Emergency Preparedness Planner to focus on strengthening health systems to ensure they are equipped to respond to public health crises. This has led to increasing leadership responsibilities, most recently serving as Planning Section Chief during Vermont's 2024 measles outbreak.

Holly Miranda's plan upon graduating from National Taiwan University is to return to the CDC as a Global Health Epidemiologist, working with partner countries to bolster their health infrastructures and improve outbreak preparedness. Rather than pursuing another field assignment, she endeavors to relocate to CDC headquarters in Atlanta to work as a Global Health Epidemiologist in the Center for Global Health's Division of Global Health Protection. If previous success is a predictor of future outcomes, then Holly will most certainly achieve her long-term career goal to become an Epidemiologist with Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF, aka Doctors Without Borders) leading disease outbreak response efforts around the globe and delivering emergency assistance to communities affected by disasters and epidemics.

Holly recognizes being a Rotary Global Scholar provides the professional opportunity of working closely with early-career epidemiologists and public health professionals and fosters a culture of knowledge sharing and collaboration. With humble gratitude, she thanks the Rotary Clubs and members of District 7690 for their monetary support to The Rotary Foundation which enables The Rotary Foundation to return a portion of the funding back to the District as District Designated Funds (DDF) to support the Global Grant Scholarship program. She is extremely appreciative of the Rotary Club of Taipei (D3481) and the Rotary Club of The Sandhills (D7690) who Unite For Good in active partnership as sponsoring clubs during her graduate studies period. Beyond the academic rigors and practicum experience in NTU's MS in Global Health program, Holly desires to engage with Rotary clubs in Taipei to participate in service projects related to public health.
